Planned Giving Campaign: This weekend we will be starting the invitation for people to re-evaluate their giving to the parish and I am confident that you will give serious reflection to this important matter which we have not visited for a long time.

Church evacuation last Sunday: The health and safety authorities require every parish to carry out an unannounced evacuation drill from time to time. For a first effort, last week's procedure went well: it took 1 minute 45 seconds for the first two Masses and 2 minutes 10 seconds for the 10.00am Mass with far more people. Hopefully, we will not need to evacuate the church in any emergency but occasionally we will repeat the exercise.

It threw up a few observations. Apart from the main exit from the church, it is worth remembering that there are two other exits: via the sacristy into the presbytery garden and then through the doors into the carpark, and the other fire exit is near the choir area. Books, etc should just be left in the benches, and even on such an occasion, it is prudent not to delay your exit by using the holy water stoop. Every priority and thought should be given to getting out of the church.

Finally, many people mentioned an assembly point. The advice given to churches is that people should get as far away from the premises as possible and not assemble. I think this has been a very useful exercise.

CORONA virus advice. The Bishops Conference of England and Wales have issued advice based on Government guidelines which are that we are currently at a low risk situation in this country. If this changes further counsel will be given. In the meantime, the NHS has issued these suggestions:

CATCH it ~ germs spread easily. Always carry tissues and use them to catch your cough or sneeze.

BIN it \sim Germs can live for several hours on tissue. Dispose of your tissue as soon as possible.

KILL it ~ hands can transfer germs to every surface you touch. Clean your hands as soon as you can.
